

Guidelines on the Use of Generative AI

1. Authors must disclose any use of generative AI or other AI tools if such use makes a substantive contribution to the content, structure, analysis, interpretation, writing, or other scholarly aspects of a manuscript. The disclosure should specify the name of each AI tool used, describe the purpose and extent of its use, and be included on the final page of the manuscript or in another appropriate location. Disclosure is not required if AI tools are used solely for routine proofreading or language editing, such as checking spelling, grammar, typographical errors, or stylistic consistency, provided that no substantive content is generated or materially altered.

2. AI tools must not be listed as authors or co-authors.

3. Authors remain fully responsible for the accuracy, originality, validity, and research integrity of their manuscript, regardless of the use of AI tools. This responsibility extends to all aspects of the manuscript, including its text, materials, data, analyses, interpretations, conclusions, references, and citations. Authors must verify the accuracy and reliability of any content generated with the assistance of AI tools by consulting primary or other authoritative sources.

4. The Editorial Board may request additional information regarding the use of AI tools, revisions to the disclosure statement or manuscript, or supporting documentation, where considered necessary.

5. Material failure to disclose the use of AI tools where required under these Guidelines, the provision of false or misleading information regarding such use, or the inclusion of false statements suspected to originate from AI tools, fabricated references, or citations to non-existent or unverifiable sources may be regarded as a breach of these Guidelines. In such cases, the Editorial Board may take appropriate action, including suspension of the review process, rejection of the manuscript, rescission of acceptance, correction or retraction after publication, and any other measures deemed appropriate by the Editorial Board.

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
